WELCOME FROM THE PRESIDENT

It is my pleasure to welcome you to the 33rd Annual Meeting of the Society of Gynecologic Surgeons. We are looking forward to an important and informative meeting. Your participation is an important component of the meeting's success, and we greatly appreciate your contribution. This year's meeting has the three main focus points of academic medicine- patient care, research and education.

This years SGS postgraduate course will be a presentation of diagnosis and management of complications encountered in pelvic surgery. It will provide an interactive, evidence and case based approach to the diagnosis and management of failed continence surgery, postoperative voiding dysfunction, erosion or exposure of materials used in vaginal reconstruction, and complications from minimally invasive reconstructive procedures.

In order to facilitate advances in the teaching of gynecologic surgery, the Research Committee formed a Systematic Review Group (SRG). The objective of this group will be to review systematically the important subjects and controversies in the field of gynecologic surgery and to produce annual evidence-based clinical practice guidelines. Dr. Joseph Lau, a director of the Cochrane Review, will lead the workshop.

To advance research in our young investigators, the research committee has been developing a fellows' research network, which will enhance fellows in training, research skills and thinking, and help develop multi-center projects within gynecologic surgery. An update from last year's education retreat, which developed multi-site education protocols, will be presented.

I have the pleasure of inviting Dr William Cliby, a gynecologic oncologist from the Mayo Clinic, to be the TeLinde Lecturer. Dr. Cliby will be updating us on the progress in our specialty joining the National Surgical Quality Improvement Program. I look forward to discussing progress in gynecologic surgical research during my presidential address.

Program Chair, Dr. Deborah Myers, has organized an excellent panel discussion on "New Technologies - What are the issues?" The panel discussion will be an interactive case-based discussion of issues that surround new technology and their use in practice. The panel includes members Drs. Thomas Julian, Charles Nager, Bob Rogers and Mr. Jason Kim, an investor in new medical products.

The scientific program for the meeting promises to be superb. It is reflective of the talented investigators who join us to further the goal of creating excellence in the surgical care of women.

This and more will be presented at the Omni Orlando Resort at ChampionsGate in sunny Florida! We hope you have a wonderful time and an excellent educational experience.

PROGRAM GOAL

The goal of the annual scientific meeting is to provide member and non-member attendees with a forum for the latest and most innovative developments in gynecologic surgery. This will be accomplished through lecture, slide, video and poster presentations. Oral presentations are followed by a discussion and a question and answer session.

- 3) Understand benefits of lymphadenectomy in advanced-stage ovarian cancer.
- 4) Describe methods of diagnosing and management of complications encountered in reconstructive pelvic surgery.
- 5) Describe issues and ethics in adopting new technologies into one's practice.
- 6) Describe the latest developments and therapeutic dilemmas in non-surgical and surgical treatments for gynecologic and urogynecologic disorders.

WILLIAM A CLIBY, MD

Associate Professor

Dr. Cliby received his undergraduate degree in biology and economics from St. Lawrence University in upstate New York. He graduated from University of Vermont College of Medicine in 1987, and then completed residency in Obstetrics and Gynecology at Duke University. Following residency Dr. Cliby completed fellowship in gynecologic oncology at the Mayo Clinic. After joining the staff at the Mayo Clinic he completed an additional research fellowship in Oncology Research at the Fred Hutchinson Cancer Research Center in the laboratory of Drs. Stephen Friend and Lee Hartwell.

Dr. Cliby maintains a research laboratory with funding from the NIH and several cancer foundations. The focus of the lab is elucidating mechanisms of DNA damage response and investigating novel targets for therapeutic strategies in gynecologic cancer. He has authored over 65 peer-reviewed manuscripts. Clinically, Dr. Cliby's focus is on the surgical management of gynecologic cancers with an emphasis on techniques for cytoreduction of ovarian cancer. The main emphasis of his clinical research has been outcomes and quality improvement in gynecologic surgery. He is currently co-chair of a committee of the Society of Gynecologic Oncologists working with the American College of Surgeons and the American College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists to investigate a subspecialty module in gynecologic surgery within the current National Surgical Quality Improvement Project database.

Dr. Cliby will discuss opportunities for quality improvement in gynecologic surgery during his lecture.

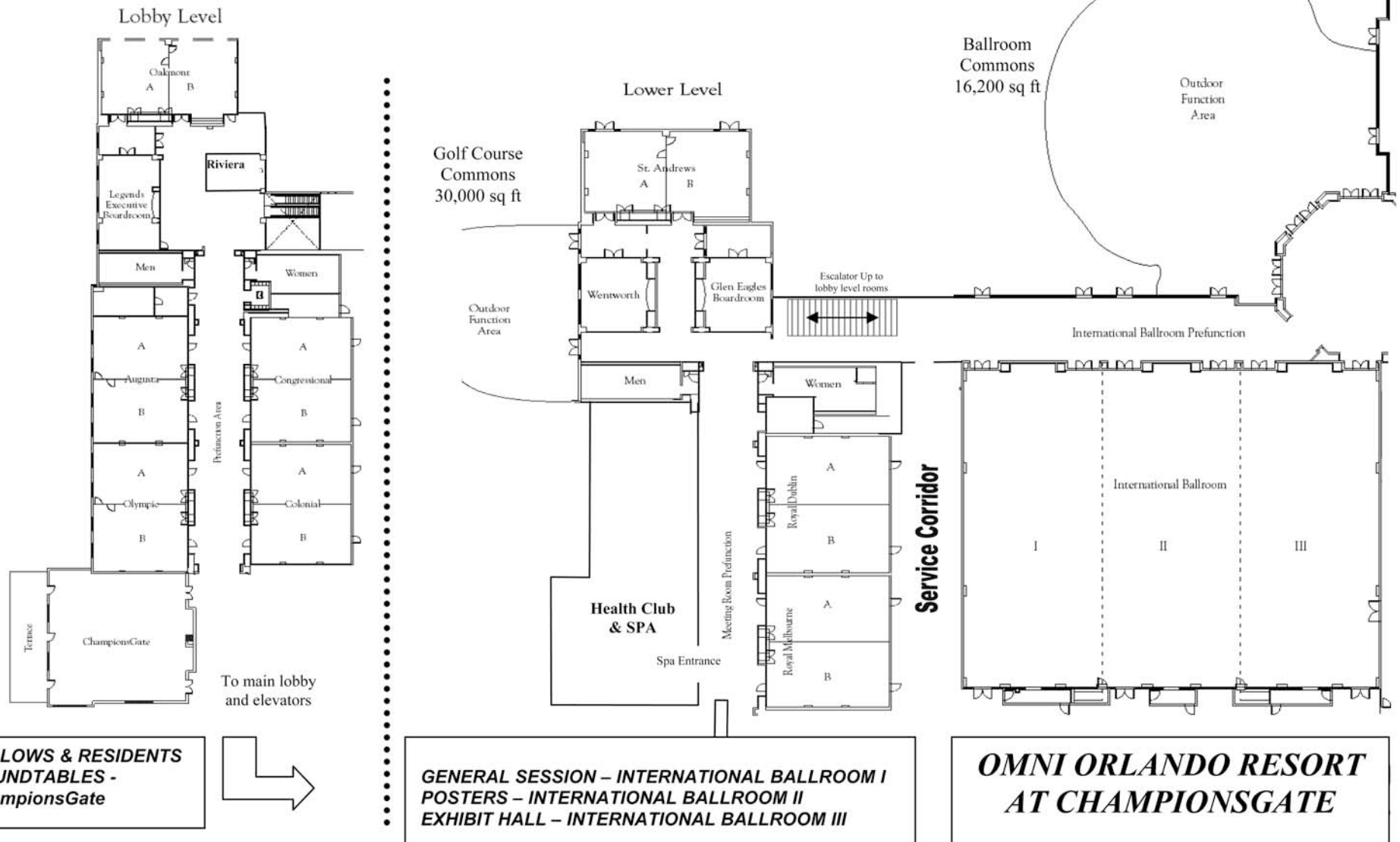
