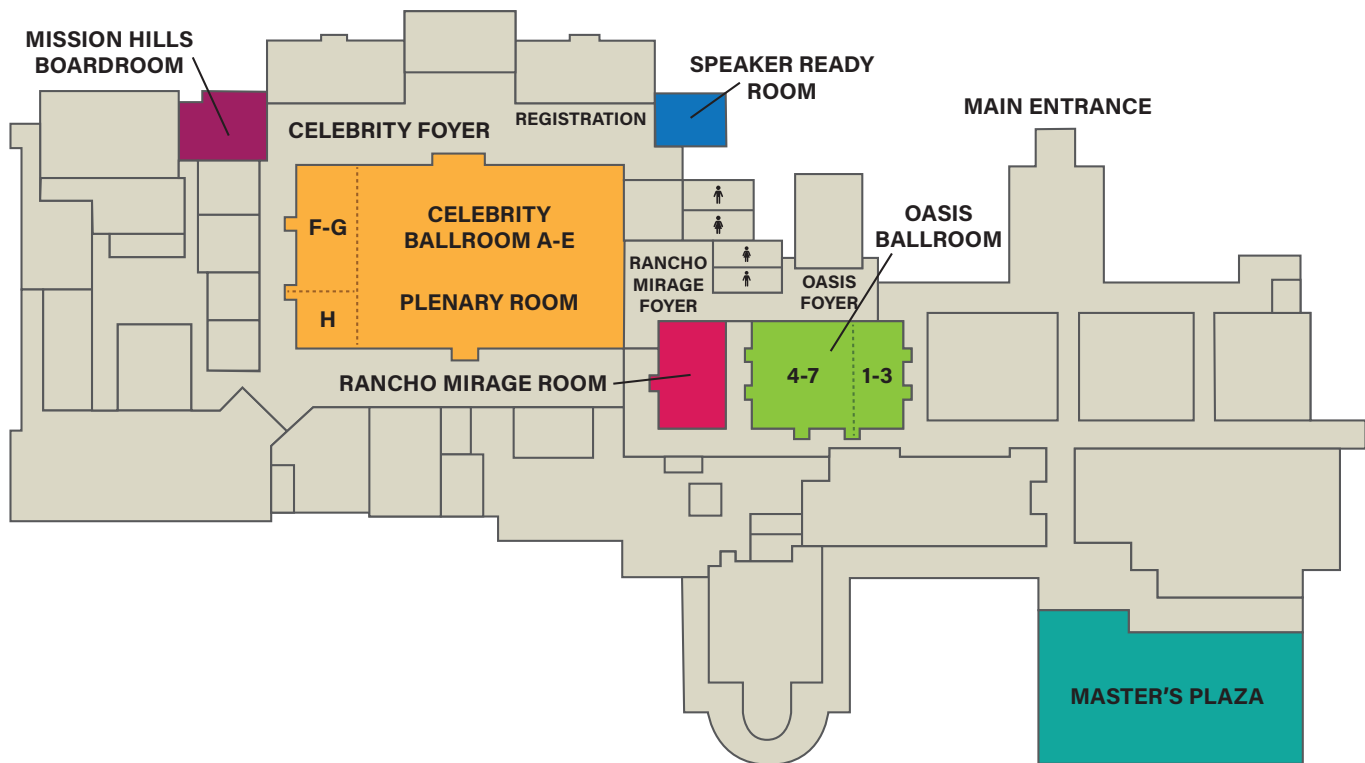
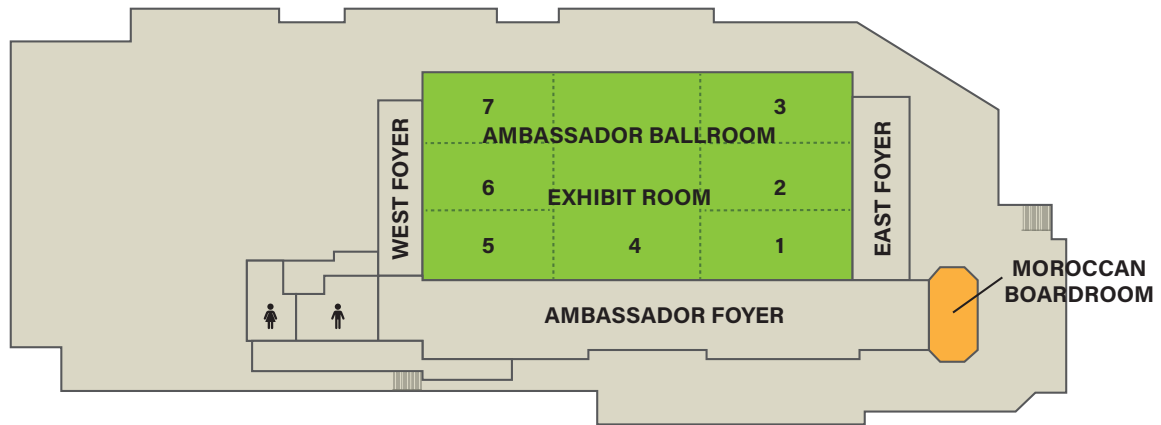

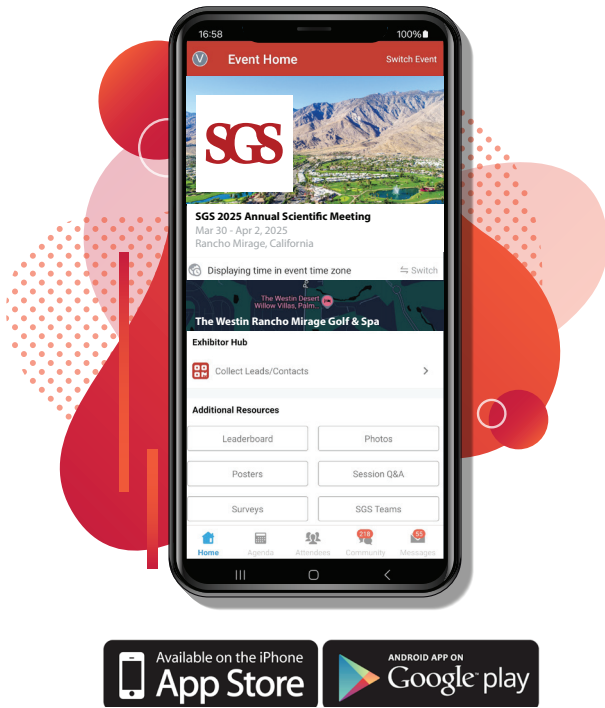

Shannon Cohn is a filmmaker, lawyer, and social impact producer who has worked globally on topics related to women's health and gender equity.

Her films have aired on PBS, Nat Geo, Discovery Channel, Amazon, and Netflix in over 100 countries. Her latest PBS film, *Below the Belt*, executive produced by Hillary Rodham Clinton and Rosario Dawson, has screened on six continents, including over 20 US medical schools, at the NIH's 27 Institutes for its 20,000+ employees, and on Capitol Hill for members of Congress co-hosted by Senator Elizabeth Warren and Senator Mitt Romney.

Before Shannon was a filmmaker, she practiced international law and was part of the team that prosecuted Enron Corp. in the largest white-collar crime investigation in FBI history. Shannon has appeared on Good Morning America, The View, and PBS NewsHour and spoken on women's health at the United Nations, Gates Foundation, the Clinton Global Initiative, and more.

She is a member of the NIH NACHHD Advisory Council, WEF Global Alliance on Women's Health, the SWHR Endometriosis Working Group, and a recent two-term member of the Foundation Board of the AAGL.

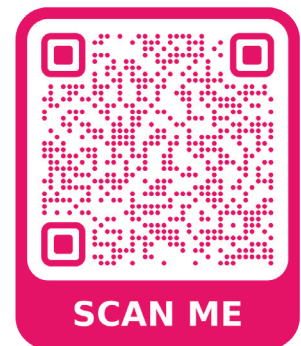

What Makes a Good Surgeon

Amy Young, MD joined the American Board of Obstetrics and Gynecology (ABOG) as the Executive Director in September 2023. She also served as an ABOG Specialty examiner from 2003 to 2022. Dr. Young previously served as Vice Dean of Professional Practice for Dell Medical School at The University of Texas at Austin and Chief Clinical Officer for UT Health Austin, the medical school's clinical practice. From 2015 to 2019, she served as the inaugural Chair and Distinguished Professor of the Department of Women's Health for Dell Medical School. She served as the Interim Chair of the Department of Diagnostic Medicine and continues to serve as Professor in the Department of Women's Health at Dell Medical School. Prior to her time in Austin, she served in several integral leadership roles at Louisiana State University School of Medicine in New Orleans and Baylor College of Medicine in Houston.

Nationally, Dr. Young has served as the President of the Association of Professors of Gynecology and Obstetrics (2012-2024) and the Society of Academic Specialists in General Obstetrics and Gynecology (2018-2020). Additionally, she served as Vice-Chair and Chair of the American College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists District XI. Dr. Young earned her medical degree from University of Mississippi and completed her Obstetrics and Gynecology residency at Baylor College of Medicine. Dr. Young is the ABOG MBER representative for the ABMS Board of Directors and also a member of the Committee on Continuing Certification (3C).

He is Professor of Obstetrics/Gynecology and Division Chief of Minimally Invasive/Robotic Gynecologic Surgery at the University of Miami, Miller School of Medicine in Miami, Florida.
